# Inclusion Gloucestershire Annual Report 2023-2024



#### A message from our Chair and CEO

On behalf of the Board and Senior Leadership Team, we are pleased to share our Annual Report for 2023–24. We look back and reflect on an exciting year for Inclusion Gloucestershire, in which we:

- Reviewed our Three Year Strategy, making it even more ambitious for disabled people
- Launched new projects around neurodivergence, including Life in the Mind and Zig Zag
   Peer Mentoring
- Delivered significantly more training, including Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training
- Secured further Lottery funding following the initial three and a half years of funding for our advocacy work
- Continued to deliver many of our existing projects, all aiming to empower disabled people and reduce or remove disabling barriers in society

We are proud to have a strong team, led by disabled people, that supports inclusion and challenges inequity. We are grateful to the organisations that we work in partnership with, the funders that make our work possible, and our many supporters, from volunteers to members.

## **Our Impact in 2023/24**

Our Inclusion Hubs in Gloucester, Coleford and Cheltenham and our women's only Wellbeing Hub, delivered from the Friendship Café, welcomed anyone with a disability or mental ill health.

The hubs provide a safe space for socialising, taking part in meaningful activities, building links with the community, completing courses

## **Our Impact in 2023/24**

#### **Quality Checking**

135 person-centred quality checks were completed.

We continued our work on the LeDeR Quality
Assurance Panel.

#### **Our Experts by Experience**

are key part of the LeDeR programme in Gloucestershire ensuring the voices of people with learning disabilities and autistic people are heard. Our bimonthly newsletters share a case study to highlight learning and good practice.

1513 people had Oliver McGowan Tier 1 training.

We delivered Oliver McGowan Train the Trainer training to 174 people.

We quality checked

34

LeDeR reviews

287 people took part in other training courses.

Training courses were run on:

- ⇒ Health Awareness
- ⇒ Easy Read
- ⇒ Safeguarding (Level 2)
- ⇒ Simulation training for health and social care students
- ⇒ And... other bespoke training

We delivered Research
Champion training to 8
people from the Muslim
community.

MHELO's membership increased by 7% to 64, and social media reached 1,200 people.

We shared 12 Life in the Mind podcasts between January 2023 and March 2024, and received 29,000 video reviews on TikTok.



Our audited accounts are created alongside our annual report. These are the records of our money for the year that have been checked by a special accountant (an auditor).

The report and the audited accounts get uploaded to Companies House and the Charity Commission. These are bodies that make sure that companies and charities are well run.


