What do I have to do in this job?



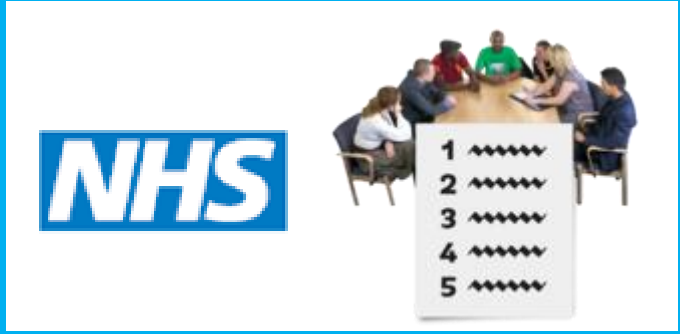
Speak up about what people with a Learning Disability need.



You may need to speak and listen in meetings.



Talk and listen to the NHS about ideas to make healthcare better.



Meet with NHS staff and others to give your feedback.

These meetings could be face to face or by video call.

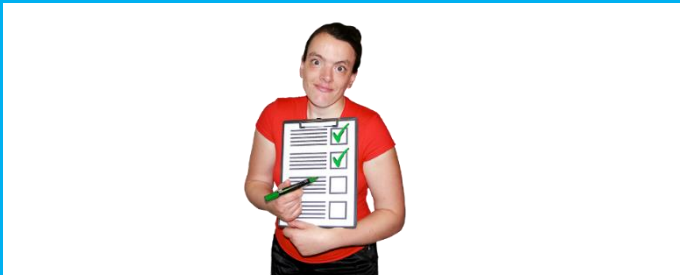
What do you need to be able to do?



You need to have a learning disability.



Be happy to talk in front of other people, including healthcare professionals.



You need to do what you said you are going to do.



You need to be able to record your ideas by writing, speaking or something else. It is ok if you have a supporter to help with this.



Be good at being on time or doing something on time.



We need to trust you with confidential information.



You need to be able to use Microsoft Teams and/or Zoom.

What makes good co-production



Inclusion Gloucestershire believes all staff should
