Our Work on the ReSPECT process

ReSPECT stands for *Recommended Summary Plan for Emergency Care and Treatment*. We are working hard to make sure healthcare workers and people with a Learning Disability or Autism have the resources they need to help with ReSPECT.

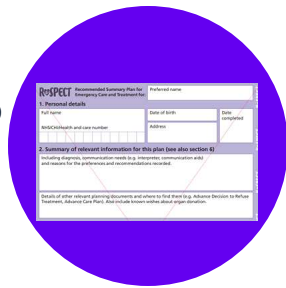

Other things we have been working on

The Telehealth Pilot Project - this involved using electronic devices by care staff to monitor a persons health, for example keeping an eye on their blood pressure and temperature. Healthcare workers could then show what a persons normal "unique wellness" was and it helped to show when a person may be unwell. Action from Learning - our plan

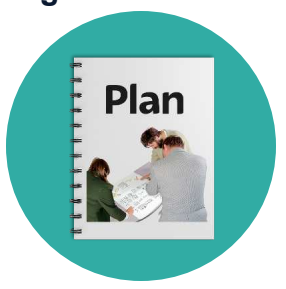
